Q IV] Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow: (20)

It was midday, the sun blazed overhead and we had been walking for hours. I wanted to believe that the wisp of blue in the distance was the River Padma – our destination. However, I was worried that it may be an <u>illusion</u>. The river is the official boundary between India and Bangladesh and has changed its course so many times I feared it might have vanished altogether.

Finally, a ribbon of cobalt blue swam into view. We reached the high bank, when in the water below us, we saw a crocodile with a long snout. The reptile's body glistened in the sun. She seemed unafraid of us and we guessed she was guarding eggs buried in the sandbank. We dug energetically until we found the nest while being watched carefully by its owner. We were hoping to rear her young safely in captivity and then release them, but she did not know that.

That was in the mid-1980s. We did not know it then, but this may have been the last time gharials nested in Bangladesh. The problem was that no one knew enough about this unusual crocodile to be able to help it. This is what made me work as much as I could in India, Bangladesh and Nepal so that I could save the gharial. What sets the gharial apart from all other crocodiles is its unusually long snout. The slim jaws, lined with sharp teeth, are ideal for catching fish.

We saw a big, male gharial and heard his underwater territorial jaw-clap. The gharial is the only crocodile to advertise its presence in this way under water. Though it was winter – a time when crocodiles bask on the sandbanks to warm up – this male spent most of his time in the water, alert to any male who might try to take his position.

The beautiful Satkosia Gorge in Orissa appears to have everything a gharial could want – fish, sandbanks and <u>protection</u>. Threats such as bamboo-rafting and net-fishing have been eliminated. When I visited the gorge during the monsoon in mid-July, I saw how small streams had become torrents. The river had eroded the banks and uprooted trees.

Fishing is a massive issue. In supposedly protected areas, we saw several gharials whose snouts had got tangled in nylon fishing nets. It was clear that, despite the rules, nets were being set at night, entangling gharials that tried to swim through them or attempted to eat the netted fish. The crocodiles did not drown, but they were left unable to open their jaws. Thus, they were in danger of starving to death.

Though the gharial is not in as much danger as before, our strategy of captive-breeding has not been enough. The species faces an uncertain future and its survival is closely linked with the needs of the humans dependent on the rivers. Our campaign is a part of a much larger effort to ensure the survival of these rivers. The threats – from development, pollution and climate change – increase day by day, but we are hopeful that people are at last ready to do what it takes to save the gharial, the finest example of a healthy river.
