

Without wasting a second, Stephen jumped onto his quad-bike and raced up the mountain with Patsy in pursuit. The night before, Stephen had fenced the sheep in the farthest pasture up the mountain slope. It had been the only pasture that still had any grass for the sheep. Now, it was the closest to the bush fire. Hot smoke blew hard on Stephen's face as he and Patsy hurried up the mountain, guided mostly by the distant sound of bleating sheep.

He reached the fenced pasture, unlocked the gates and threw them open. Patsy rushed inside the pasture. All around, the woods were barely visible through the thick smoke. There was no way to be sure how close the fire was. However, Stephen knew one thing for certain. There was not much time before the fire reached his farm. Trusting Patsy to do the job, Stephen climbed back onto his quad-bike and sped downhill. He opened the gates of all the pastures so the sheep could get to the safest paddock quickly. At the paddock, Stephen waited for his sheep.

The sun had come up by now, but all Stephen could see was dust and smoke swirling in the air. In a while, he heard the sound of sheep bleating. It grew louder until he saw them emerge from the smoky air. They walked huddled together, without any sign of panic. Stephen counted the sheep as they entered the safety of the paddock. The entire herd of nine hundred sheep had returned safely to the paddock.

They were being driven by Patsy herself. Darting to and fro at their rear, Patsy had guided them to safety. When the animals were all safe, Stephen attached a water tank to his tractor and went up the slope to fight the fires. Patsy's story gained her a large following of fans from many countries and she came as a beacon of hope, inspiring Australia's recovery from the bush fires of 2020.
