Q IV] Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow: (20)

I was nineteen when I saw my first tiger in the wild, and it was every bit as thrilling as I had imagined. I was in the Kanha Tiger Reserve in Madhya Pradesh, seated on a young tame elephant that was barely six feet tall. The elephant and its teenage trainer were being trained to track tigers by more experienced trackers on much larger elephants. I sat behind the trainer and hung on to a rope as the elephant struggled up a steep slope amidst thick bamboo.

Suddenly, a flash of orange caught my eye. There, beside the narrow path, sat a handsome young tiger. For a heart-stopping moment, our eyes met in mutual surprise. The tiger was so close that it could have easily leapt onto our elephant and pulled us down, but it just sat there calmly, looking at us with curiosity. As my elephant climbed to the top of the slope, the striped cat *faded* from view.

Since that day several decades ago, I have had many close encounters with wild tigers during my career as a wildlife filmmaker, but that first glimpse will always remain special. Despite its status as our National Animal, the tiger is highly endangered and a few more than three thousand survive in our forests. According to Dr K. Ullas Karanth, a leading tiger expert, India's forests can easily support seven thousand more tigers if we take care of our surroundings. This requires understanding what tigers need in order to survive and taking steps to remove the threats they face.

Most of us are aware that tiger poaching is a major threat. Every part of the tiger, be it its skin, bones or body parts, is in high demand in China and parts of Southeast Asia. The skin is used for decorative purposes and the bones and body parts are used as ingredients in traditional medicine. Although there is no scientific evidence for the effectiveness of tiger products in treating illnesses, deep-rooted cultural beliefs fuel the increasing demand.

With tigers having been driven to extinction in most other Asian countries, India's national parks and sanctuaries have become the main targets of poachers. Several hundred years ago, most of India was cloaked in forest and thousands of tigers roamed the length and breadth of the country. However, as the human population increased and agriculture expanded, forests were cut down to such an extent that tigers are largely confined to the green islands we call national parks and sanctuaries.

Another threat is the *rampant* poaching of prey by people living in and around our nature reserves. Using a variety of methods, including traps, guns, arrows and poison, large numbers of deer and other animals are illegally hunted for meat. When prey animals become scarce in the forest, it affects the tiger population.

For example, a tigress that can raise four cubs in a forest with plenty of prey, may not be able to raise even one cub successfully in a forest where prey is scarce. If no new tigers get added to the population and if the ones present are hunted or die of natural causes like territorial fights and old age, the tigers in that forest will soon go extinct, as they have in some of our reserves.
