Toby Workman stared out of the window of his room in the space station. He was looking in the direction of the mist-covered Earth, 5,000 miles away. Toby had been working at the station for only a month. Many high-school students joined every summer to build up a flying record which would help them become successful rocket pilots.

The week before, Toby had been piloting a sightseeing rocket for vacationers from Earth. It was his first task. While they were coming into dock at the space station, something happened to the brakes and the ship bumped into the building where the spacecraft was to be parked, injuring several people. It was discovered that nothing was wrong with the rocket and Toby was unofficially accused of <u>carelessness</u> while further investigation was being carried out. If no mechanical defect was found in the spacecraft, Toby knew he would be suspended from space flying.

Suddenly, over the wall speaker of his room came another appeal for a pilot to carry Dr Shepard and his daughter – a nurse trainee to the moon to give medicines in a sudden outbreak of contagious fever. "I am the only licensed pilot in the space station right now," Toby said to himself. "The express spacecraft that was bringing the other pilots from Mars would not arrive for a long time. A delay may let the fever grow into an epidemic. I am going to try it." Toby began pulling out flying gear.

As he looked for a spacecraft, Toby saw the investigating crew examining the big spacecraft in which he had the accident. Their report would arrive any time. After he had <u>launched</u> the ship on a smooth path, Toby heard footsteps. It was Dr Shepard and his daughter who wanted to meet the pilot. Toby prepared himself for unpleasantness.

When Dr Shepard recognised Toby, he furiously said, "You are incompetent! I thought your licence had been revoked! If you believe you are doing something heroic, consider that you are risking the lives of us who could be of service to those people on the moon!" Dr Shepard paused a moment for breath, then went on. "A person your age has no business flying rockets in the first place. It is a job for older men with mature judgment!"

Dr. Shepard's daughter, Deb was a quiet girl who could not believe the worst in anybody. She too was doing extra summer work in order to earn her space nurse's grade. Her father was considered to be one of the best space surgeons. On the last leg of the journey, Toby heard a buzz on his radio set. It was Lieutenant Cameron, the Operations Officer at the space station. Toby's heart froze as his message came through.

"I have been instructed to tell you that this is your last trip as a pilot. The investigation of the spacecraft in which you had the accident is nearly complete and there seems to be no mechanical defect upon which the disaster can be blamed. I am afraid it boils down simply to a serious error of judgement. I am sorry, but the chief says your licence will be revoked upon your return to the space station." Although the message was not a surprise, it made Toby feel all empty and hopeless. The fact that he was responsible for his passengers pushed him to complete his job.
